1. Original story. Make it up to read or tell.
2. Retelling a story. Choose a story you know and retell it in your own way.
3. A reading. Choose your favourite story to read or tell.
4. Narrative poem. Make up your own poem, or read one that you know and love.

STORY BOSSO TIPS AND GUIDELINES

- Choose a story that you like or know. A story you know can be easier to tell.
- Practise your story as often as you can before recording it.
- You don't have to learn it by heart. Stories can change a little each time they are told.
- Choose descriptive words to help build a picture in your listeners' heads.
- Be calm! Speak slowly, clearly and with expression. Your story must be no longer than 3 minutes.
- Before you tell your story, clearly state your name, age, contact details, language and category of choice. Also state the name of your story, if you have one.
- Re-record your story until you're certain you're happy with how it sounds.
- Visit nalibali.org or nalibali.mobi for more ideas on how to tell or read a story, and to sample stories in any of the 11 official South African languages.

TALENT SEARCH RULES

- There is no age restriction. Anyone can enter!
- Each clip should be no longer than 3 minutes.
- Stories can be told in any of the 11 official South African languages.
- You can submit a story you've told on your own, with a friend, family member or a classmate.
- No offensive words or language may be used.
- All entries must include a name, age, contact details, language and category of choice.
